



## Y2: what can you see at the seaside

### Key Vocabulary

Seaside	A place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort.
Erosion	When materials are worn away and transported to a new location
Sea defences	Ways of protecting the land from being flooded or worn away by the sea
Beach	A narrow, gently sloping strip of land that lies along the edge of land.
Tide	The alternate rising and falling of the sea due to the attraction of the moon and sun.

### Key Information

- The waterbodies surrounding the UK are the North Sea, Atlantic Ocean and the English Channel.
- The North Sea is located on the East coast.
- Erosion is a major problem on the East coast.
- Bridlington is a coastal town located on the Holderness coast.
- The Holderness coast is 61km long, running from Flamborough Head to Spurn Point.
- Flamborough Head, located North of Bridlington, is a chalk cliff suffering from high rates of erosion.

### Key Human and Physical Features

#### Human

Piers, coastal defences, ports, harbours, shops, houses, cafes, restaurants

#### Physical

Beach, cliff, coast, sea, ocean.

### Similarities between Bridlington and Mexborough

- Both are towns in Yorkshire
- Both have similar human features, such as, churches, schools, hospitals, transport hubs.
- Both have a market.

### Differences

- Bridlington is located on the coast and Mexborough inland.
- Bridlington is a tourist destination.
- Bridlington has a coastline which is eroding, Mexborough does not suffer from erosion.
