## **Planned Y5 Educational Visits**

We have planned educational visits for Y5 children for this academic year. We hope that by sending this information out early in the year it helps you to plan ahead. We appreciate parents need more time to plan with the cost-of-living crisis currently impacting on all our finances. Educational visits not only offer learning to strengthen curriculum knowledge but they help to improve children's social and emotional wellbeing as well as offering them a wide variety of experiences.

### **7.2.24 - Doncaster field study and mosque visit**

Year 5 children will be visiting a mosque as part of the RE learning on Islam. A visit to a mosque is a fascinating opportunity for the pupils to get an insight into a modern Muslim community and meet some of the lovely people who live and work there. We hope it will bring pupils' learning to life and allow them to be curious about the faith and its practices. We will be pairing this visit with our Geography field work study and looking into Doncaster as a local community too and even squeezing in a visit to DANUM.

#### **How this links to our children's learning:**

- RE curriculum: children see a place of worship and find out more about life as a Muslim.
- Geography: children will find out about people's thoughts on their local area.
- Children will learn about conducting themselves in public, public speaking and safety in public.
- Art: visiting the museum which includes a vast collection of artefacts and shows how the environment in Doncaster has changed.
